No visitors to CATV's busy office last year could have known 2019 was a time of waiting.

CATV waited for the FCC to create a rule that would adversely affected our funding. We waited for new servers to arrive from China while the federal government vaciliated on tariffs, and CATV waited for Comcast and the Vermont Public Utilities Commission to reach a mediated settlement that affects CATV's operations.

Our waiting was not passive. We lobbied Washington and the VT and NH state-houses to keep the fiscal wolves at bay. CATV kept old transmission equipment in service until new servers arrived, a process that demanded almost daily resuscitation, and CATV took part in the Comcast-Vermont mediation.

But the community did not have to wait. The CATV crew was fast to assist, record, air and archive local government meetings and community shows. We were fast to offer assistance so community members and non-profits could use the CATV studio, A/V recording equipment, and editing suites. CATV was eager to teach job-worthy media skills to anyone who wanted to learn. School classes on field trips used the CATV studio. The CATV summer camps brought middle schoolers joy, sparked their creativity, and helped them get comfortable with media equipment. Film competitions sharpened the video skills of local amateur filmmakers. The disenfranchised and the socially conscious used CATV's tools to amplify their voices.

When I take stock of all the compelling local content we made and aired this past year, I know CATV's crew achieved our mission with excellence and passion...and the community is better for it.


